Disability Inclusive Emergency Planning (DIEP) Forums

- **Activate** inclusive community-led preparedness conversations.
- **Facilitate** shared learning among multiple stakeholders from the disability, community, health, emergency, and government sectors.
- **Prioritise** pre-planning for the extra support needs of people with disability in emergencies.
- **Build** community willingness and capability to share responsibility for the organisation and delivery of supports so that nobody is left behind.
